MINUTES

SOUTH CAROLINA CONSERVATION BANK SCDNR BOARD ROOM, 1000 ASSEMBLY STREET, ROOM 335 COLUMBIA, SOUTH CAROLINA THURSDAY, JUNE 24, 2004, 2:00 P.M.

The third meeting of the Board of the South Carolina Conservation Bank was held at 2:00 P.M. on Thursday, June 24, 2004, at 1000 Assembly Street, Columbia, South Carolina. Notice of the date, time and place of the meeting was posted and mailed to the news media. Chairman Charles Lane presided at the meeting.

Staff members of SCDNR were present at the meeting as were various guests.

I. Call to Order

Chairman Lane called the meeting to order at 2:00 P.M. and welcomed everyone to the meeting. Freedom of Information Rules and Requirements have been met. Chairman Lane advised that we are in business due to the guests in the room and some that were not there and the team approach that was pursued. He thanked Marvin Davant for his efforts.

II. Adoption of Minutes

Chairman Lane stated that the minutes of the last meeting have been mailed to the members of the Board and asked if there were any comments on the minutes. Mr. Tom DeLoach made a motion that the minutes of the August 14, 2003, meeting be approved. Mr. Tommy Miller seconded the motion and the motion carried unanimously.

III. Burnie Maybank

Mr. Burnie Maybank, Director, SC Department of Revenue, was introduced. He discussed the tax ramifications, appraisals, tax incentives for conservation easements, charitable deductions and cooperation of his agency with the SCCB. He advised that certain documents would be available on their website in October 2004, that would be of interest to the SCCB. He advised that a desk audit has already been started on land trust compliance. He stated that his agency would be glad to be of help to the SCCB and will be happy to assist with the first few appraisals and related matters.

Mr. Davant asked Mr. Maybank about the status of the Land Trusts listed on the SC Land Trust Network. He stated that it would all depend on how they filed with the Department of Revenue. Each trust is to file a 501(C)3.

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IV. Qualified Entities

Chairman Lane asked each guest to introduce himself or herself and make any comments that they would like to make.

Ronnie Feaster and Shawn Balstad from the Natural Resources Conservation Service. Ms. Balstad gave some background information on their federal agency and presented a Fact Sheet on their Farm and Ranch Lands Protection Program which provides matching funds to various entities to purchase conservation easements. Ms. Balstad stated that their agency would be happy to work with the SCCB.

Emily Cope, Habitat Protection Coordinator, SCDNR, gave an overview of SCDNR's land acquisition program which includes the Heritage Trust Program, Wildlife Management Area Program, Focus Area Program, boat ramps, office space, and different land acquisitions that were purchased with federal funds and various partners. SCDNR is committed to protect habitat in the state and is looking forward to working with the SCCB.

Joel Felder, SC Forestry Commission, represented that state agency and their agency owns forested lands across the state and is involved in the management of those lands.

Mark Robertson, The Nature Conservancy, South Carolina Chapter, stated that his group is a nonprofit conservation group that has facilitated the protection of more than 200,000 acres in South Carolina. Mr. Robertson gave the historical background of his group. He complimented the SCCB Board for the job it has done in getting established and funded. He is looking forward to working with the SCCB.

Will Haynie, Lowcountry Open Land Trust, stated that his Trust is donor and foundation supported. They promote the protection of land in the Lowcountry. He complimented the SCCB Board and is looking forward to working with the SCCB.

Norman Brunswig, National Audubon Society, gave the historical background of his group. They promote bird conservation and also land protection. He stated that his group will be glad to help the SCCB in any way needed and is looking forward to working with it.

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Charles Harrison, SC Parks, Recreation & Tourism, represented this state agency. They manage the SC state parks and are interested in land conservation. He stated that his agency is looking forward to working with the SCCB.

Rodger Stroup, SC Department of Archives and History, represented this state agency. He is interested in the SCCB since 10% of the funding may go to historical, cultural and archaeological resources. He stated that his agency would be delighted to work with the SCCB and provide any assistance that they can give.

Ken Driggers, The Palmetto Conservation Foundation, represented his group. It is a statewide nonprofit group that promotes outdoor recreation, land and water conservation, preservation and military heritage and publishing valuable information on South Carolina.

George Fields, The Palmetto Conservation Foundation, works with Revolutionary War projects. He stated that they look forward to building a partnership with the SCCB.

Harry Lesesne, The Conservation Fund, was unable to attend due to an illness in his family. Mr. Davant read a statement from Mr. Lesesne. The Conservation Fund works to protect the nation's legacy of land and water resources in partnership with other organizations. Some of the projects that they have work to protect in South Carolina are Jocassee Gorges, Edisto River, Wee Tee, and the recent acquisition of Bonneau Ferry. The Conservation Fund is proud of its ongoing partnership with the SCCB.

V. Old Business (Policies and By-Laws)

Chairman Lane asked the Board members if they had any questions or comments on the policies that were approved last year. Mr. Davant asked that they take them and review them. Mr. Miller asked for clarification of the statement that 10% would go towards historical and archaeological sites. Mr. Davant stated that the statute indicates that the Board may authorize 10% for those items.

VI. New Business

A. Resolution – Mr. Davant read the resolution thanking The Conservation Fund for providing operating funds for a year and a half for the SCCB. Chairman Lane asked if there were any comments.

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Mr. DeLoach made an amendment that each Board Member signs the resolution. Chairman Lane asked if the Resolution was approved subject to the amendment. Mr. DeLoach made the motion that it be approved. Mr. Adams seconded the motion and the motion carried unanimously.

Resolution – Mr. Davant read the resolution regarding the operation of the SCCB at no cost due to the offer of SCDNR. Chairman Lane asked for a vote of approval for the resolution. Mr. DeLoach made a motion to approve the resolution. Mr. Miller seconded the motion and the motion carried unanimously.

Chairman Lane thanked Rita Pardue for her work for the SCCB.

B. Adoption of Application Deadlines - Mr. Davant suggested that due to the budget limitations and the Bank's funding process that the Board should wait until further into the process to determine the actual deadlines. An initial 90-day period has been recommended, which would be October 1, for an application deadline. That will give the staff 30 to 45 days to review the application, probably making the first grant check in mid November or December. After reviewing deadlines of various organizations, the NAWCA deadlines in March and July were recommended by Mr. Davant. After the first year, the SCCB will be on a standard plan with the same dates each year. Mr.DeLoach questioned how funds would be committed. Mr. Davant advised that the funds will come in monthly – approximately \$900,000.00 per month funds will be provided. Mr. Miller asked if monthly statements would be provided. Mr. Davant advised that they could be provided. He explained the process. The money will come into the State Treasury from the county. A monthly statement will be sent to the SCCB of the amount in the trust fund, as well as in the operational account, as well as interest income. When the Board makes a grant, assuming that all documentation is provided, it will be sent to the Comptroller General's office, then forwarded to the Treasurer's Office, and they will cut a check and send it back to the SCCB. The SCCB will then forward it to the proper recipient. The Board will have a 45-day window to review. Chairman Lane recommended we use

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NAWCA as a guideline and asked for a motion to accept the deadlines. This motion is being made for the first process. The October grant deadline is a one shot deal because it will be the very first one. After the first application, the deadlines of NAWCA will be used, which are March and July. Mr. DeLoach made the motion to accept the deadlines as presented by Mr. Davant. Mr. Miller seconded the motion and the motion carried unanimously.

- C. MOU with SCDNR Chairman Lane advised that the agreement with SCDNR expires at the end of this month. SCDNR is willing to extend it for an additional year. Mr. Davant advised that The Memorandum of Understanding Between the SCCB and the SCDNR before you is a one-year extension of the MOU and it is in the same form as in the previous year, except that the SCCB will reimburse SCDNR its costs in providing said services. Mr. Davant advised that it is a cost savings to the agency to remain with SCDNR and reflects interagency cooperation that the Governor is asking for. Mr. Weathers made the motion to stay with SCDNR. Mr. DeLoach seconded the motion and the motion carried unanimously.
- D. 2004-2005 Operating Budget Mr. Davant presented the operating budget. This budget was based on last year's budget. Mr. McShane questioned whether \$3,000.00 was enough budgeted for legal services. Mr. Davant advised that this figure was used two years ago and he did not know if legal services would be needed. Mr. McShane asked if the SCCB was able to utilize an agency lawyer now. Mr. Davant advised that the Legal Section has given him advice with reference to certain items. This budget is subject to change. Mr. DeLoach wanted the SCCB to pursue legal services from the Attorney General's office.

Mr. McShane asked that Mr. Davant monitor his expenses to use as a future reference. Mr. Davant thanked Mr. McShane for the help of SCDNR.

Mr. Davant advised the Board that mileage for the Board had been included in the budget. Mr. McShane commented that the SCDNR Board does not take a stipend or reimbursement for mileage. Chairman Lane made the motion that the Board does not Minutes Page 6 June 24, 2004

receive reimbursement. Mr. Adams seconded the motion and the motion carried unanimously.

Mr. Davant advised that the operating budget was given as information.

VII. Date, Time and Place of Next Meeting
Chairman Lane advised that the Board needs to meet in advance of
the applications coming in. After discussion, the date of the next
meeting will be Thursday, September 2, 2004, 2:00 P.M., in the
SCDNR Board Room.

Mr. Weathers asked to look at some of the NAWCA projects that have been approved at the next meeting.

Mr. Davant reminded everyone of the event at Millaree starting at 6:00 P.M.

Chairman Lane thanked the supporters of the SCCB. Mr. McShane asked that a list of the supporters be added to the minutes. He wanted Governor Mark Sanford to be on this list.

Comments were made that Chip Campsen had resigned from the Board when he decided to run for office. Chairman Lane advised that there is a vacancy on the Board to be appointed by Senator Glenn McConnell. Mr. Davant advised that he needed to follow up to see if anything else needed to be done with reference to the vacancy on the Board.

VIII. Adjournment

There being no further business to be brought before the Board at this time, the meeting was adjourned.
